## PLANTING DAY: NATURE TRAIL

Our new Nature Trail and outdoor classroom is ready for planting on Tuesday 6 August. School families are invited to join in and help. If you are interested, please come along at 9am or 11am in your gumboots and with gardening gloves, ready to help. Extra wheelbarrows and spades/trowels would be appreciated. You can collect your child from their class, and come and do some planting.

Those students whose parents have donated to our lasting legacy will be invited to participate, even if their families cannot attend. Our student leaders (ambassadors, councillors, eco-warriors, PB4L leaders, peer mediators) will also be invited.

All students who participate will need to bring warm, old clothes, an old towel and gumboots (if they own them).

On the day, instructions will be given by Susan Warrington (landscape designer) about how and where to plant, and we hope to have sufficient adults available to help our students participate.

The landscape design is available for viewing at the office. Groundcover plants are shown below. Lasting legacy native trees will be supplied and ready for planting too.

Hebe Wiri Mist NZ: Very hardy in Auckland, gives good cover, a tidy, low groundcover.



Arthropodium Cirrhatum Reinga Lily, flowers in deep shade and is a NZ native plant w/o allergy concerns.



Phormium cookianum NZ Mountain Flax . Good screen along the walkway fence line grows to 1m with drooping leaves. Low maintenance, easy plant, grows well in 50% shade. Flowers attract birds in spring and summer. Use flower spikes in floral arrangements. Fronds can be cut from the outside ring of fronds for flax weaving but they are shorter than the tenax variety.

## Lasting Legacy Donations: What is the Lasting Legacy?
